It is world history served at the table.*





HIGHLIGHT

From bustling Padang to the cool highlands of Bukittinggi, today reveals the soul of West Sumatra. We explore a vibrant traditional market and Old Town coffee culture before heading into the Minangkabau heartland. At Rumah Gadang Silaing Bawah, heritage comes alive through architecture and traditional dress, followed by authentic village-style Padang cuisine and local coconut pancakes. The day ends beneath the iconic Jam Gadang, where Bukittinggi crisp mountain air, street flavors, and cultural charm create an atmosphere found nowhere else in Indonesia.

DAY ONE | Thursday 4 June 2026

- Breakfast in Hotel
- Check out then visit wet market Padang
- Coffee at Old Town Padang
- Visit Rumah Gadang Silaing Bawah and Dress-Ups
- Lunch Padang resto in Aie Angek village
- Stop by at Bika Talago local coconut pancakes and Sumatran coffee
- Check into Santika hotel Bukittinggi
- Visit Jam Gadang and walk around city sampling street food and Dinner

HIGHLIGHT

The morning begins at Pasar Bawah, where the scent of fresh spices, ripe tropical fruit, and sizzling street snacks fills the air. We slow down over brunch at Uni Lis, savoring comforting local flavors before heading to Taman Panorama, where Bukittinggi's cool mountain breeze and sweeping green valleys set a tranquil tone. Nearby, the Japanese Tunnel reveals layers of wartime history carved into stone. After lunch, we continue to Pandai Sikek Village, home to master weavers whose intricate songket textiles reflect generations of Minangkabau artistry.

DAY TWO | Friday 5 June 2026

- Pasar Bawa and brunch at Uni Lis.
- Taman Panorama: Starting with nature sets a relaxing tone for the day.
- Japanese Tunnel: This follows logically as a historical site nearby.
- Lunch: A good break after exploring, positioning you for the afternoon.
- Pandai Sikek Village: Close to Bukittinggi, this allows you to see weaving without having to backtrack.
- Back to the Hotel, Rest and Free time
- Dinner





HIGHLIGHT

We begin at the Hatta Museum, honoring Indonesia's first Vice President, Mohammad Hatta, before continuing to the majestic Istana Basa Pagaruyung, a striking symbol of Minangkabau royal heritage. Along the way, sweeping views of Ngarai Sianok set the scene before we visit the historic Masjid Tuo Rao Rao, one of West Sumatra's oldest mosques. After a traditional Minangkabau lunch, we continue our journey back to Padang, carrying stories of history, faith, and highland beauty.

DAY THREE | Saturday 6 June 2026

- Visit Hatta Museum
- Pagaruyung Palace
- Depart for Rao Rao, Scenic Stops Along the Take a moment to enjoy the views of Ngarai Sianok and Sianok Valley.
- Stop for lunch at a local restaurant along the route then continue to Rao-Rao
- Drive to Padang from Rao Rao. The journey should take approximately 1 hour.

HIGHLIGHT

The picturesque, old city of Padang, where the echoes of history mingle with the vibrant bustle of life. This is a place where East meets West, where foreign traders first set foot and forged connections with the resilient Minangkabau people. As you wander through its streets, you'll uncover stories of how the Dutch laid out residential clusters for immigrants, creating a tapestry of cultures. Here, the market hums with the energy of the Chinese community, seamlessly coexisting and enriching the local landscape. It's a living testament to the power of culinary and cultural exchange, where every stall and vendor tells a story waiting to be savored.
